
Lutheran Women's Missionary League

Did you know?

Using Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) to Satisfy Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs)

If you are age 70½ or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. This additional taxable income may push you into a higher tax bracket and may also reduce your eligibility for certain tax credits and deductions. To eliminate or reduce the impact of RMD income, you may donate to Risen Savior or any other qualified non-profit using a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).
