


- -Based on Acts 16:16-34

- Ask: "Why were Paul and Silas sent to jail? What happened after they sang in jail? How did the jailer respond to what Paul said?" Say that Paul and Silas were missionaries. Tell kids that missionaries are people who tell about God and Jesus in our country and around the world.
- Pray. Thank God for missionaries who tell about Jesus around the world. Thank God for people at your church who tell about Jesus.


